For Safety Awareness Month, Washington Gas is sharing tips on how to safely use natural gas appliances.

COOKING SAFETY

- Clean the burners of grease and oil
- Keep a fire extinguisher near your kitchen as water can't extinguish a grease fire
- Turn off burners when range is unattended
- Never use an oven or range for heat

FURNACE SAFETY

- Have your furnace cleaned and checked by a contractor annually
- Replace air filters regularly to reduce dust
- Keep area around furnace clean and clear

WATER HEATER SAFETY

- Have a contractor perform a maintenance check every 6 months to a year, including temperature/pressure relief valve and venting
