Dear Neighbor,

At Washington Gas, safety is our highest priority as we continue reliably meeting the energy needs of our customers. Today, clean-burning natural gas is the fuel of choice for more than nine out of ten new homebuyers in the Washington, D.C., metropolitan area, and Washington Gas serves more than 1.1 million customers through the region. As the region continues to grow, rehabilitation of our existing infrastructure is critical to maintain a safe and reliable natural gas system.

To support Prince William County Department of Transportation's Route 1 – Featherstone to Marys Way road widening project in the Woodbridge Magisterial District and minimize public impact, Washington Gas is coordinating with PWC DOT to relocate existing infrastructure along Route 1 (Jefferson Davis Highway) in Prince William County, Virginia. This very important project is just one of many improvements and coordinated efforts being made across the region.

#### Construction Overview

Construction will occur at the following sites along Route 1 (Jefferson Davis Highway):

**Site 1:** Featherstone Road to Woodside Drive

**Site 2:** Rosedale Court to Village Drive

**Site 3:** Village Drive to Silverwood Lane

**Site 4:** Silverwood Lane to Wigglesworth Way

The attached map shows the approximate locations of construction. Construction is planned to start in as early as June 24, 2019 and is expected to be completed by the end of September 2019. Construction schedules may be affected by weather and other unforeseen circumstances. As permitted, work will typically be performed between 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. Monday through Saturday.

#### What to Expect During Construction

You can expect to see Washington Gas and contractor vehicles and equipment, and you may hear construction noise. Washington Gas works to minimize traffic disruptions as much as possible and adheres to approved traffic control plans. Please follow traffic control signs for lane closures, reduced speed limit information, and parking restrictions. For your safety, do not enter construction areas or approach vehicles or equipment.

#### Restoration


Temporary restorations will be made immediately following the completion of this construction project. Permanent restorations will be made in compliance with the permit and will occur within 45 days after all work is completed, weather permitting. Washington Gas will restore to pre-construction conditions.
